Annual Meeting Highlights

SPRUCE DRIVE

Your President reported on the lawsuit surrounding Spruce Drive. Due to the population increase in our development and the concern for the safety of our homeowners, the Board elected to make Spruce Drive, the road by the pond, accessible to all, including emergency vehicles. Arlene Greene, who is a non-member of the association living on the west corner of Spruce Drive and Lake Road (which is a town road) sued us to prevent us from removing the dirt which was on the road, and also tried to take adverse possession of our property known as Spruce Drive.

Without going into great detail, the law suit was addressed by our attorneys and the road has been made available for your use.

OUR ADJACENT NEIGHBOR

Potential developers of the 70 acre parcel to our immediate west (the land adjacent to the lots on Cedar Lane), want to subdivide that acreage into 26 building lots. We believe they are having a problem with their plans because the only access to the property is from a narrow road off Upper Seese Hill Road and Barrett Township now requires 2 entrances to subdivisions. They contacted the Board and requested access to Birch Road from their property as a second entrance.

The Board reviewed their monetary offer as well as the potential impact this request would have on our lifestyle and decided to reject their offer. As of yet, we have not heard anything more from them. Please forward any comments you may have on this matter to the Board at the address shown above.

SECURITY SYSTEM

As reported at the meeting, the Board of Directors is looking into a security system for the pool area as there have been reported violations which will ultimately affect our insurance coverage. Unfortunately, the blatant disregard of a *few* will cost the *majority* in our efforts to maintain a safe environment for all.

MEMBER IDENTIFICATION TAGS

The Board is also planning to have a "tag" identification system in place shortly. These tags will identify home/lot owners/tenants so the lifeguards will know who is eligible to use the facilities. By the time you read this, if you have not paid your dues, you will be considered delinquent and unable to use the pool. This identification will also serve to keep non-residents of our community from using the pool unless they are accompanied by a home/lot owner/tenant.

ROADS

Our roads chairman, Grover Cleveland, reported that we have contracted to have our entrance repaired and sealed, and to extend the blacktop into the corners of Hemlock Way and Birch Road. The plan is to do a portion of our roads each year until they are all covered in blacktop. Potholes will continue to be filled in each year and necessary retrenching will be done in preparation for this future road paving.

Also, there are plans to improve the access to the pond to supply water to the fire department in an emergency. This will be done by re-enforcing the access to the pond or by the use of a hydrant.

FALLEN TREES AND OTHER DEBRIS

The past several ice storms have caused many weak branches and even whole trees to fall within our community. This, coupled with the efforts of the electric company to clear their wires, has resulted in the creation of piles of debris that are an eyesore and need to be addressed.

The Board has begun to clean up the public areas around the pool and would like all homeowners to take responsibility for their own property. Particular emphasis should be put on the area inside 25 feet from the center of the road. Fallen debris impedes the flow of water in the drainage ditches and diverts it into the roadway itself causing additional erosion of an already fragile roadway.

If you do not have the equipment to clean up your lot yourself, please contact the Board and they will provide you with several names of contractors who will help you. Good logs can be cut up for your fireplace and rotten wood can be put into mulch. It only takes a little effort and expense on your part to help keep our community looking rural - not sloppy. Please do your part to help in this effort.

SPRUCE HILL SPRUCE UP!

We would appreciate your continued efforts to keep your property and our roadways free of litter. Many of you take walks for your health - so take a walk for yourself, and then take another "cool down" walk for the community by carrying a plastic bag and picking up any trash you see.

- * A camp stove, a lantern, candles, matches, and/or a flashlight with batteries as well as a fire extinguisher is important.
- * A transistor radio and a cell phone
